Neuropsychological assessment (NPA) is the systematic evaluation of the brain-behavior relationships in an individual. The purpose of an NPA is to define the client's specific cognitive strengths and weaknesses and to identify the relationships between the neuropsychological findings and the client's medical and psychiatric condition.

Neuropsychological Assessment - an overview ...

A neuropsychological assessment is a comprehensive and in-depth evaluation of an individual's processing abilities (memory, attention, sensory perception, motor skills, language, and behavioral and emotional functioning). Patterns of strengths and weaknesses in skills are interpreted from a brain-behavior point of view.

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Neuropsychological Assessment Progression. Before neuroimaging technology became available in the middle of the 20th century, assessing individuals through “tests” for possible brain injuries and diseases was the sole means of diagnosis. But now that neuroimaging devices usually “diagnose” areas of brain damage, brain tumors, and various types of brain diseases with high degrees of accuracy, the purpose of neuropsychological assessments has shifted.
